

Universities have commenced making course offerings to students for admission in 2020. Congratulations to those students who have received an offer through various early entry schemes. Below are a few important points to note:

- Macquarie University Leaders and Achievers early entry scheme closes on Monday 26 August.
- ANU Conditional Offers I sent an email to all Year 12 outlining the process of accepting a conditional offer from ANU. I would encourage parents to speak to their sons to ensure they follow the instructions outlined in my email.
- UAC early bird closes on 30 September. Students will need to submit and pay the processing fee of \$70 by



this date.

- Schools Recommendation Scheme (SRS) closes on 30 September. Students need to submit their UAC application first before they can
 apply for SRS.
- Educational Access Scheme (EAS) This scheme is aimed to help students, whose education has been negatively affected during Year 11 and/or Year 12, receive an offer to university. EAS closes on 29 November.
- Elite Athlete and Performer schemes These schemes are aimed at students who have experienced disruption to their studies due to elite sporting or performance commitments and, if successful, can be eligible for bonus points. Every university has its own online application for this scheme, which can be found on their website.
- Interstate university applications close on 30 September.


