OUR GUEST SPEAKERS

Dr Marco Raftopoulos (OKG02) is a paediatric and adult ENT Surgeon in Sydney. Dr Raftopoulos studied Medicine at the University of New South Wales and completed his Specialist ENT surgical training in 2019. Dr Raftopoulos then completed a further sub-speciality International Fellowship in rhinology, advanced sinus surgery & skull base disorders.

Dan Schofield (OKG15) is a current postgraduate Doctor of Medicine (MD) student at the University of Sydney. He is currently completing his final year of university-based studies and practical training rurally at Dubbo Base Hospital through the University's School of Rural Health. His presentation will focus on unpacking the pathways into medical school and the life and opportunities as a postgraduate medical student in Sydney.

Thomas Lee (OKG18) is a graduate Paramedic from the University of Tasmania, Sydney campus with a Bachelor of Paramedic Practice. During his studies, Thomas was selected for early employment with NSW Ambulance as a Casual Trainee Paramedic as part of the response to COVID-19. Thomas' presentation centres around the variety of entry pathways into Paramedicine, alongside the benefits and challenges of undertaking an expedited degree pathway.
