INTRODUCTION

Knox Grammar School's commitment to providing its students with a holistic education is seen through its Co-Curricular program, providing ample opportunities, in a variety of areas that cater to students' interests, whilst developing their resilience, character, creativity, sportsmanship and understanding. This guide aims to provide parents and students with an overview of the Co-Curricular opportunities offered at Knox.

You will note in this brochure the Co-Curricular activities offered at Knox are divided into six pillars; Academic, Clubs, Sport, Social Justice, the Creative and the Traditional.

Neil MacNeil, the School's first Headmaster saw the advantages that Co-Curricular offerings could provide for students in facilitating student's development of these global competencies. The success of the school's co-curricular program can be seen through both the student numbers enrolled in these activities, and their achievements.

The da Vinci Program is an example of one of the lighthouse co-curricular programs offered, the Cadet Program is the largest unit in the southern hemisphere, the Performing Arts program (KAPA) has over 35 different choirs, ensembles and bands achieving excellent results in competitions but more importantly in providing pathways for student's passion and love of music. Programs continue to evolve in the Club, Leadership, Oratory, Exchange and Service Learning areas.
