Over the weekend, our Cross Country squad showed remarkable resilience and teamwork at the Trinity Relays held at Ewen Park in Hurlstone. With 40 students ranging from Years 7 to 12 participating, the School fielded 10 teams in a series of 4x2km relay races. Despite facing thunder delays and heavy rain, the Knox boys demonstrated impressive grit and determination, all while maintaining a spirited camaraderie.

In the Open division, Knox's standout team comprised of Archie Hetherington (Y8), Miles Phijidvjan (Y10), Sam Tan (Y10), and Lachlan McIntosh (Y12). This quartet not only finished as the fastest Knox team, but also made a significant mark on the competition, placing 7th overall and 2nd among CAS schools.

The Junior 1st team also made a strong impression. Well done to Y7 boys Thomas Berg, John Brivilus, Jacorian Shen, and Nicholas Watkins, who all competed with remarkable energy. They secured 10th place overall and 7th among CAS schools.

Special mention goes to one of Knox's senior 4x100m sprint teams, who bravely took on the 4x2km relay challenge. Their willingness to step out of their usual event and compete in the longer distance is a testament to their commitment to challenging themselves for the upcoming CAS Track and Field season.

School Sport Australia Swimming Championships

A team of 12 Knox boys attended the 2024 School Sport Australia Swimming Championships held at the Gold Coast Aquatic Centre at the end of July. All swimmers that competed represented NSW in several Individual and relay events.

Each final was well represented by Knox swimmers who were also regularly sharing the dais together. The 15 Years boys 50m Butterfly was an all Knox podium – Lukas Dunn (Y9), Ethan Haegebaert(Y9) and Dylan Zhou (Y10).

Special mention to Ethan Haegebaert, Jack Mitchell (Y10), Tristen Waugh (Y10), and Lukas Dunn who were selected to swim as part of the Gold Medal winning NSW 15-16 4x50m Freestyle relay team. A rare achievement for a team to be comprised of all Knox students!

Congratulations to the team who were excellent representatives of the School. The team finished the four-day event with a total of 13 Individual Gold, 10 Individual Silver and 6 Individual Bronze Medals. The boys also returned with 4 Relay Gold, 1 Relay Silver and 3 Relay Bronze medals.
