Students whose results are not available in time for December Round 2 can be assured that they will not be disadvantaged – universities will still have places available to make offers to all courses in January Round 1

QILT Graduate Outcomes Survey Results

The 2020 Graduate Outcomes Survey – Longitudinal (GOS-L) measures the medium-term outcomes of higher education graduates based on a cohort analysis of graduates who responded to the 2017 Graduate Outcomes Survey (GOS).

The proportion of undergraduates in employment in 2017, four to six months after completing their course was 86.9 per cent, while three years later, 93.3 per cent had secured employment. The labour force participation rate measures the proportion of graduates available for employment. The labour force participation rate of graduates shortly after course completion was 92.3 per cent and this remained unchanged over the medium-term. Three years out, the median salary level among graduates in full-time employment had increased from \$60,000 to \$75,000, an increase of 25 per cent.

Our application main round will continue on a rolling basis until Semester 1 commences in February 2021 for all programs, except for the Bachelor of Nursing which closed on 30 September due to high demand (refer to previous communications).

Complete applications will receive an outcome within 2 weeks and offers will be made to eligible applicants based on Year 11 and mid-Year 12 reports.

Applications need to be submitted directly to us through our online form and not through UAC. Applicants with a conditional offer pending final HSC results will be contacted prior to Christmas to advise if their conditions have been met. If students have a conditional offer and would like more information or help understanding their next step, our team in the Prospective Students Office can help. We encourage students to accept their offer as soon as possible by following the instructions provided in the offer email. Accepting an offer does not require any payment and does not lock applicants in, however it does mean we are able to secure their place.

Online enrolment for the 2021 Semester 1 intake will open soon. Applicants who have accepted their offer will receive instructions for enrolling online and we'll be standing by to provide help if needed.

Undergraduate November interviews

Monash interviews for various international cohorts are undertaken in November.

By early November applicants for the University of Newcastle/University New England will know their fate in terms of whether they have received an offer to attend an interview.

Indigenous interviews have also commenced for applicants to Western Sydney University. Around mid November James Cook, Charles Sturt, University of Newcastle/University of New England and Monash international applicant undergraduate interview processes kick in, with UWA, University of Newcastle/University of New England, University of Adelaide and Western Sydney joining by late November.

Late November deadlines -The end of November signals deadlines for students who want to apply for the Bachelor of Philosophy as a pathway to medicine at ANU. These applicants need to submit application forms by the end of November. At UNSW, the 30th November is the last day for international students not sitting Australian or New Zealand Year 12 examinations to lodge applications with UNSW Admissions. It is also the last day for international applicants to submit their UNSW Medicine Application Form.
